






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
Friendship Terrace celebrated July 4th with a cookout followed by a rooftop party to watch the firework show from the Monument.

HOUSE RULES HIGHLIGHTS

Resident's agree that the following House Rules and any additional reasonable rules and regulations subsequently adopted by Landlord/Owner of which Resident receives reasonable notice shall be part of this lease and shall be incorporated by reference herein. Resident further agrees that any failure by Resident, or failure by others on the property with the consent of resident, to abide fully by such rules and regulations may be deemed by Landlord/Owner as a default by Resident and breach of this lease:

17. OBSTRUCTIONS- Resident agrees:

- Sidewalks, entries, hallways, passages, and stairways shall not be obstructed, nor shall they be used in a manner that would unreasonably delay or impede a resident from entering and exiting the building and apartments.
- The breaker box (circuit panel) cannot be blocked. This does not apply to a hanging picture that can be easily removed.
- Access to windows in each room of the apartment cannot be blocked.

18. VEHICLES- There are a limited number of parking spaces that can be leased from the property on a monthly basis for a fee. Parking fees shall be considered additional rent. To be placed on the waiting list for a parking space, please see the Front Desk. All Residents leasing a parking space must be registered with the Administrative office at the time of move-in. Residents who do not lease a parking space may obtain a Zone 3 parking permit from the District of Columbia to park on the street. Residents may not perform any vehicle maintenance on the premises.

A Few Important Building Reminders:



Seabury Speaks: Protect Medicaid, SNAP, and Services for Older Adults

As Seabury Resources for Aging® enters its 101st year of serving the Washington, DC region, we are both proud of our legacy and concerned by what lies ahead for older adults in our country. Recent federal legislation rolls back critical safety nets that millions of older adults rely on for survival—not just for comfort, but for basic necessities like food, housing, transportation, and healthcare.

At Seabury, we see every day what happens when people fall through the cracks of the current system. We serve individuals who have spent a lifetime working, caregiving, and contributing to our communities—only to find themselves aging alone, on fixed incomes, and without reliable access to care. For these older adults, programs like Medicaid, the Older Americans Act, and SNAP aren't extras. They are lifelines.

It's not time to pull back, but to step up.

At Seabury, our mission has always been clear: to support older adults as they age with dignity and independence.

Seabury serves 1/3 of the (free) meals provided DC Lead Agencies to older adults;

The Seabury Connector is the ONLY group senior transportation services in the region;

Our Care Management *Equity Fund* is the ONLY subsidy available in the region for famillies who need support but have limited resources:

Friendship Terrace is one of the few senior communities left to include meals as part of independent living because of how important healthy, shared meals are to aging well.

We hope that our leaders will consider the long-term consequences of this legislation and remember that aging is a universal experience. The decisions we make today will define how we all age tomorrow.

For now, Seabury refuses to let go of a vision where everyone has the resources they need to age with independence and dignity. Thank you for sharing in that vision with us.


