
DC Department of Transportation visits Seabury at Friendship Terrace


A Safe Space for Older LGBTQ Adults










How charming he was! How lovely she! Then in a flash they were out of sight. Lifting my glass, I toasted the pair "Bon voyage! Have a marvelous flight!"

In The Spotlight Maildred Raiford





There are many extraordinary intelligent, charming fun-loving individuals residing at Friendship Terrace Senior Living. And I am delighted to say, Mildred Raiford is indeed one of them.

I met Mildred during a "getting to know you" event at Friendship Terrace where we each introduced ourselves to the group.

I discovered through our conversation that Mildred was the wife of Gil Raiford whom I had met previously here at FT.

During my initial conversation with Mildred, I learned that she was born on March 23 1941 in Weldon, North Carolina in a town near Roanoke Rapids. Her father George Faulcon, and mother Emma Whitehead Faulcon, were both born in Littleton NC.

Mildred recalled being part of an extremely happy, optimistic family consisting of her parents, and five children (four boys and Mildred.)

As a youngster, Mildred particularly recalled her father's outgoing personality, and her mothers' stay-at- home disposition. Although her father only possessed a third-grade education, "schooling" was significant in his life. As a matter of fact, he valued education more than most could imagine.

To demonstrate his esteem and respect for education, Mildred's father listened intently while his children recalled that which the teachers verbalized to them. He took it all in as if he were the student.

When they told their father that the teacher informed them that they needed specific amounts of milk each day to remain healthy, their father listened intently. He was so impressed with the information that he hastily brought home a cow so that his children would have an even chance for healthy growth, of mind, body and spirit. There was always excitement when Mildred accompanied her brothers, "she felt like one of the boys." Fortunately, her brothers would often allow her to tag along with them.

They would leave home early in the morning when the weather was cool. and the sun was just awakening from a long night's sleep. And the ground was cool. More often than not, young Mildred would abandon her shoes and go barefoot on these trips.

However, on the return trip home many hours later, the sun would have reached its pinnacle and the road was scorching hot.

Sadly little Mildred's bare feet would absorb the brunt of the heat and She would plead with her brothers to ride her on their backs to avoid the burning roadway. Often, they refused, and this meant she had to travel the hot roads with feet feeling as if they were on fire. Mildred believes this was their punishment of her for not wearing shoes as they had warned her.

Unfortunately, young Mildred did not learn her lesson because she would repeat the same no shoes scenario time after time.

Mildred does not recall her first day of school specifically. However, she does remember that her oldest brother took her to school and at lunch time one of her brothers would ride by on a bicycle to deliver her lunch and that made her feel special.

Mildred was a good student. She loved learning new things. She was quiet and composed in school, and admits that learning excited her and relaxed her simultaneously. She also relished performing in live theaterdramas and musicals. Because of her interest in theater and music Mildred was afforded numerous free camping trips by various organizations.

Mildred believes that her interest in music emanated from her piano lessons in elementary school, and that interest did not waned, but persisted.

Mildred was an excellent student throughout elementary and middle school and teachers were always willing to assist her in any way possible

After completing the necessary courses, in 1958 Mildred graduated high school as Valedictorian. Upon graduation she was accepted to Hampton University, located in Hampton Virginia. She made the decision to apply to Hampton because one brother graduated from that school and this inspired a special attachment for Mildred.

Mildred was active in the Civil Rights Movement of 1960's as she attended the 1963 March on Washington, which was a significant event in her life.

Mildred's first job after completing her education was teaching high school English in Edenton NC. She also admits that the most challenging job she ever had was in Miami, Florida where her duties included procuring employment for those who were previously confined to mental institutions. It was at a New Hampshire camp resort where Mildred and Gil Raiford met as employees. Much of their initial conversation centered around their matriculation At twenty-three years of age, Mildred consented to marry Gil. Their marriage produced four wonderful children.

One of Mildred's treasured possessions is her photo album. Her photo album, which grows in size by the day, allows her to recall various parts of her life. She can reminisce as she reviews the images over and over again. The images are strategically placed in the album to tell a story.

It allows her to pause during any portion of her life and bring back fond (and a few not so fond) memories of specific phases of her life.

Her album will permit her to add photos as the future dictates. According to Mildred, her photo album is a part of her legacy to family and friends.

Mildred believes she missed a great opportunity when she did not talk to and ask questions of her older relative more than she did. She is sure she could have learned much from her ancestors.

And now for the poignant part of the story.

As a Friendship Terrace resident, Mildred Raiford became an active participant with the Friendship Terrace Resident Association. In spite of some debilitating side effects from several serious surgeries, Mildred performed an outstanding job as Secretary of FTRA.

Thank you, Mildred Raiford, for being a remarkable role model for all of us. We at Friendship Terrace are indeed grateful that you and Gil are part of the phenomenal Friendship Terrace family.
